



Crayon Roll-up



Holds 12 crayons, perfect for diaper bags, gifts, Halloween treats, stocking stuffers & birthday parties!

Cut 2 pieces: 12.5" by 5"

Cut 1 - 12.5" by 6" for the piece that goes over the crayons

Cut 1 - 12.5" by 5" of lightweight fusible interfacing

Cut 1 - 25" by 1" of fabric for ties or 25" of ribbon

--1 yard medium Rick Rack (optional) & Crayons

--coordinating thread, sewing machine, scissors, & pins



Iron fusible interfacing to the wrong side of the fabric that you want to be on the inside

Fold 12.5" by 6" piece in half & iron



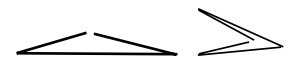
Flip over piece with interfacing, line up the bottom of it with the bottom of the folded piece, pin.

Starting at the left edge, measure in 1.25" sew a line parallel to the edge. Then sew a parallel line every inch.



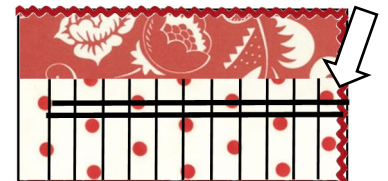
Optional - If using rick rack or trim, pin it all the way around the outside edges.

Ties are next. I like the fabric ties, I think they stay tied better or you can use ribbon. You're going to make a double fold binding. With your 1" by 25" strip, iron in half. This gives you a crease to line up with.

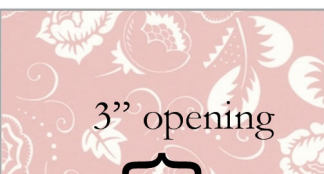


Then open up & take each little side and fold in 1/4" or to the press mark you just made & iron. Then fold again & iron. You should have a little strip that doesn't have any raw edges that's about 1/4" wide. Cut this strip in half.

You'll have 2 pieces that are 12.5" long. Top stitch each strip, making sure to backstitch at one of the ends. Place the ties on top of the crayon area at one end (see arrow). Pin.



Put second red piece (12.5" by 5") on top of pocket piece, right sides together. Using a 1/4" seam allowance sew around the edges, leave a 3" opening for turning.



Cut any excess on the corners. Turn inside out, press edges. Now topstitch all the way around, fold in the opening & catch this all together as you sew.
